## Elmbridge Borough Council - New Local Plan

The draft Local Plan, which does not include the release of any Green Belt land, is supported and approved by the LDRA. At the time of writing, the LDRA has not received any update on the progress of the Local Plan. The Government's change in approach to planning and the options being discussed give us hope that Elmbridge's submission will be viewed favourably.

## Village Green Application – One Tree Hill and Stokes Field Nature Reserve

The Village Green application will be heard at Public Examination 24<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> April 2023. The 'Save HWLD Green Belt' team need to raise a significant amount of money to cover the legal costs, (funding options below). We need Village Green designation to protect our green open spaces in perpetuity. In years to come Councillors & Officers will have changed and there may be a completely different perspective on the importance and value of Green Belt. We need to act now and protect this land forever.

## **Planning Applications**

<u>Aldi Store</u> – Aldi submitted a planning application (ref. 2021/3857) for a store on Portsmouth Road, by Giggs Hill Green in Thames Ditton. Whilst the application was refused last August by the planning committee, Aldi have lodged an appeal.

<u>Lynwood Roundabout</u> – Planning application submitted for flats. Permission refused on grounds of 'Inappropriate development'.
