Taylor Wimpey development proposal on Long Ditton Green Belt

In June, Taylor Wimpey conducted a public consultation to present its proposal for a development comprising 150 homes on Green Belt land extending from Hill Park Roses to the summit of One Tree Hill. A planning application has been submitted to Elmbridge Borough Council (ref. 2025/2018), which has sought to justify the reclassification of the land as 'grey belt' and to secure approval for development. The Long Ditton Residents' Association (LDRA) opposes this proposal and has contested the application, seeking to protect the Green Belt land. The 'Save HWLD Green Belt' group, backed by the LDRA, organised a public meeting at the Village Hall on 11th September where there was a full discussion on the application and suggestions as to the comments which could be made on the EBC website by the deadline of 19th September.

Hook Park development proposal on Chessington Green Belt

In June, housebuilder Poppymill held a public consultation to outline its proposal for a development of 2,000 homes on Green Belt land adjacent to Chessington Equestrian Centre, next to the A3. A planning application will be submitted to the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames, arguing for the land's reclassification as 'grey belt' and approval for development. The LDRA is opposed to building on Green Belt land and is particularly concerned that this proposal would result in significant traffic congestion in Long Ditton and Hinchley Wood, especially in light of the proposed new roundabout on the A309. https://hook-park.co.uk/
